SUMMARY:

The **National Cadet Corps** (NCC) is the youth wing of the Indian armed forces and the largest uniformed youth organization in the world. The NCC was **formed on 15th July 1948**. However, the NCC day is observed throughout the country on the **fourth Sunday of November** because it was on that day **in 1947** that the **first unit was raised in Delhi**.

NCC sub unit of St. Francis College, Koramangala of 1 KAR BN NCC, celebrated the **73rd raising day** of the National Cadet Corps (NCC) on **28th November 2021**. The celebration program was planned well in advance and also included activities such as **Drill, Salami, NCC Song & Social Activity (Plantation)**, which was instructed by the 1 KAR BN NCC Unit.

The event started with the arrival of the **Chief Guest Sri. M. V. Ramakrishna Prasad**, Commandant, 3rd Battalion, KSRP, Bangalore, accompanied by the Pilates. 
